Act 129 Phase IV Incentive Payout Deadlines Announced

Phase IV of Pennsylvania Act 129 ends on May 31, 2026, and the FirstEnergy Pennsylvania electric companies would like to inform you of the important deadlines for submitting Phase IV applications and supporting documentation.

Phase IV Important Dates

May 31, 2026: PA Act 129 Phase IV ends

Phase IV projects must have been completed on or before May 31, 2026. Projects completed after May 31, 2026, can be submitted and will be evaluated as Phase V projects that are subject to Phase V program guidelines and requirements

Customers and Program Allies must submit larger or more complex project applications prior to May 31, 2026, to allow ample time for project review and approval.

June 29, 2026: Final Application Deadline

To ensure Act 129 Phase IV incentive payout for projects completed on or before May 31, 2026, the FirstEnergy Pennsylvania electric companies will accept Phase IV applications with all applicable supporting documentation until 4 p.m. EDT on June 29, 2026.

June 29, 2026: Final Documentation Deadline

All required documentation must be submitted by 4 p.m. EDT on June 29, 2026. Phase IV documents submitted after May 31, 2026, should be e-mailed to the C&I FirstEnergy-PA mailbox at: CIFirstEnergyPA@Franklinenergy.com

Phase IV Application Submission Requirements

- Project must have been completed on or before May 31, 2026
- Completed application
- Required specification sheets and certifications
- Completed final calculator
- Copy of all required itemized invoices
- W-9
- Letter of Attestation
- Signed offer letter
- Other supplementary information necessary for the approval process

Phase V Projects

Projects completed after May 31, 2026, can be submitted to energysavePA@clearResult.com and will be evaluated as Phase V projects which will be subject to Phase V program guidelines and requirements.
